**This is a special free service pack only for users who have upgraded to WF/7 software version 7.2. It fixes a number of bugs that have been discovered in the field.**

**Release Notes For Service Pack 7.2.2**

-

-A problem has been fixed that would not allow the recording of 16 or more tracks without creating database errors.

-Some MMR8 compatibility issues were discovered and have been corrected in this version.

-A "cleanup" problem that left behind bogus database entries when two or more volumes were mounted has been fixed.

-A volume-mounting bug that resulted in a "bad player" message when executing a "duplicate" or "split" recording has been fixed.

-“Current” Volume” information has been added to the lower right hand corner of the “Edit” screen. This feature has two states. First, by adding the following line in “wavefrm.ini” under [session]:

AutoSelectCurrentVolume=0

the editor will automatically display the “current volume” selector, or, if no volumes are mounted a message will so warn the user. The selector or warning message will only be displayed when starting the editor or after closing the volume manager.

**Converseley**, by adding the following under [session]:

AutoSelectCurrentVolume=1

the editor will not prompt for current volume or warn the user that there are no volumes mounted. The system operates much as it does now and will use the first volume it finds if there are any mounted.

-A problem where the current WF7 library name was replacing the original library name during WF6 imports has been fixed. The import now retains the original library name.
